The total number of credits that may be transferred to Centenary College is 65. However, it is possible that a CCM student will be able to transfer in credits in excess of those listed in the articulation agreement as Centenary's policy allows for a maximum of 72 credits in transfer from community colleges, but careful selection will be necessary to insure that the courses meet Centenary College requirements.

## GUARANTEED ADMISSIONS PROGRAM AGREEMENT

County College of Morris and Centenary College enter into this Guaranteed Admission Program agreement so that students enrolled in an eligible Associate's<sup>1</sup> degree program at County College of Morris will have pre-approved opportunities to transfer into an appropriate Baccalaureate degree program at Centenary College.<sup>2</sup>

### Degree Programs

This agreement guarantees eligible County College of Morris' Associate's degree graduates admission into Centenary College's baccalaureate degree programs with junior-level status. According to Centenary College policy, and in compliance with federal and state regulations, junior-level status is defined as having earned minimally 56 college-level semester credits toward a bachelor's degree from a baccalaureate degree granting college or university.

### Eligibility

Eligibility for the Guaranteed Admission Program requires the following:

- 1) The student must graduate from CCM with an appropriate Associate's degree.
- 2) The student must have earned a minimum grade of "C-" or above in a specific course to receive credit in transfer from that respective course.

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<sup>1</sup> The Associate in Arts (AA) and Associate in Science (AS) are recognized as the eligible transfer programs at CCM in accordance with this agreement. Centenary also accepts Associate in Applied Science degrees in transfer, but each program is individually evaluated based on its merits and relationship to Centenary's baccalaureate degree programs.

<sup>2</sup> The following degree programs at Centenary have State of New Jersey mandated, accreditation mandated, or department portfolio requirements for full admission into those programs: BFA in Art and Design; BFA in Graphic Design and Multi-Media Arts; BS in Equine Studies (all concentrations); BSW in Social Work; all education certification programs. CCM students will have provisional admissions into these programs pending the satisfactory completion of the specialized criteria.

- 3) The student must have followed a recommended academic plan of courses for the intended major at Centenary College.
- 4) The student must complete an Intent to Transfer form prior to earning 30 credits at County College of Morris.
- 5) The student must have taken all their courses at CCM.
- 6) The student must enroll at Centenary College within a year of graduation from County College of Morris.

### Obligations of Centenary College

Centenary College will:

- 1) Waive the admissions application fee for Guaranteed Admissions students.
- 2) Work with CCM to establish appropriate course articulations to ensure that CCM students will be able to seamlessly transfer to Centenary College
- 3) Work closely with appropriate CCM transfer staff to make certain that students are given current information regarding transfer requirements and procedures.
- 4) Conduct academic advising sessions each semester at the County College Morris campus as the institutions mutually deem necessary.

### Obligations of County College of Morris

County College of Morris will:

- 1) Publicize this Guaranteed Admissions Program agreement to current and prospective students.
- 2) Distribute, receive and process "Intent to Transfer" forms related to this program.
- 3) Provide accurate transfer information and advising to students who are enrolled in this Guaranteed Admission Program.

### Joint Obligations:


Centenary College and County College of Morris will:

- 1) Conduct an annual review of this agreement and coordinate changes as necessary. Changes will require written approval from both institutions prior to implementation.
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- 2) Authorize this agreement to become effective with the start of the Spring 2012 semester.
- 3) Jointly develop and implement marketing activities to attract students to the program.
- 4) Maintain and share records of CCM students admitted into the program to the extent permitted by law.
- 5) Designate a representative who will coordinate and monitor the Guaranteed Admissions Program.
- 6) Understand that all academic programs may be updated as needed, but ensure that regular communication about curricular changes will be ongoing to facilitate ease of transfer for CCM graduates to Centenary College.
- 7) Acknowledge that this agreement will be self-renewing and can be cancelled by either party without affecting student who have already completed an "Intent to Transfer" form.


