DUAL ADMISSION AGREEMENT

The College of Saint Elizabeth

And

County College of Morris

This is a dual admission agreement between the College of Saint Elizabeth's Education Program and County College of Morris which guarantees the admission of women graduates with the Associate in Science Degree in Early Childhood Education to the College of Saint Elizabeth with full junior standing. Individuals with appropriate liberal arts education (English, History, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish, French, Fine Arts) will also be granted full junior standing in the College of Saint Elizabeth Secondary Education Program (Minor).

Acceptance to the College of Saint Elizabeth with full junior status is contingent upon:

- Completion of the Associate in Science Degree in Early Childhood Education at County College of Morris or, for the Secondary Education Program, the education listed above
- Attainment of at least a 2.75 grade point average
- Suitable progress in the general education program and toward the intended major at the College of Saint Elizabeth. Please see the attached advising documents.

Admission Procedures:

- County College of Morris will offer students the opportunity to enroll in this program
 at the time of application to County College of Morris. Students will submit the
 application materials required by the College of Saint Elizabeth and the Education
 Department at the College of Saint Elizabeth to the County College of Morris in a
 timely fashion. These materials will be transferred to the Admissions Office at the
 College of Saint Elizabeth. The College of Saint Elizabeth will waive the application
 fee and inform both the student and County College of Morris of its admission
 decision.
- County College of Morris will provide the College of Saint Elizabeth with academic progress information for participating students each term. Both institutions will monitor the students' compliance with the requirements listed above.

This agreement is effective March 25, 2002. Revisions in curriculum or degree requirements at either institution will be reported to the other to determine the effect on this agreement. A review of this agreement will be conducted every two years.

Either institution upon written notification may terminate this agreement.
