#### **Articulation Agreement**

# Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration (SPAA) & County College of Morris

#### Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to enable students who graduate from County College of Morris with an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or Associate of Science (A.S.) degree to continue their education and obtain a B.A. in Public and Nonprofit Administration from the Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration as part of the Rutgers-County College of Morris Partnership in Higher Education off-campus initiative.

### Transferring Credits from County College of Morris

Students completing the A.S. in Public Administration degree from County College of Morris may transfer up to 65 credits towards a B.A. in Public and Nonprofit Administration allowing them to complete their Rutgers degree in four years. Graduates of other County College of Morris programs will have their transcripts evaluated for necessary lower-level major requirements.

## Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration - Undergraduate Requirements

Rutgers School of Public Affairs and Administration's B.A. in Public and Nonprofit Administration requires a total of 124 credits, a minimum of 35 credits in the Public and Nonprofit Administration major, 38 credits of Newark's Core Curriculum, 51 credits of additional courses, including the completion of a 2<sup>nd</sup> concentration in Rutgers University-Newark's Core Curriculum, to bring the total to 124 credits. See attached Articulation Degree Plan (Attachment A).

By following County College of Morris' A.S. as defined in the attached Articulation Degree Plan, students can transfer 65 credits to the School of Public Affairs and Administration Bachelors of Arts undergraduate program.

- Courses transferring to School of Public Affairs and Administration must have a grade of "C" or better in each course in the major.
- A maximum of 15 credits in Public Administration courses may be transferred into the Public and Nonprofit Administration undergraduate program.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 is required for admission into Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration's Public and Nonprofit Administration program. Students with less than a 3.0 will be reviewed on an individual basis.
- Students must complete 150 hours for the Field Experience requirement to be equivalent to Service Learning Internship I with supervisory and faculty approval.
- Completion of a County College of Morris A.S. degree that is compliant with the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement will meet the Core Curriculum requirements for the School of Public Affairs and Administration, as stipulated by the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement.

 Any change in the curriculum of County College of Morris or Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration Public and Nonprofit Administration program will require a review of this agreement by both programs.

#### **Special Conditions**

- Under the policies of the cooperative agreement, County College of Morris is responsible for providing 100- and 200-level courses and Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey is responsible for providing the 300- and 400-level courses.
- As County College of Morris does not offer a lower-level course that is an elective for the Public and Nonprofit Administration degree, this program necessitates an exception to the agreement. Since no equivalent to 40:834:201, Public Service as Responsible Citizenship, is available from County College of Morris, Rutgers is permitted to offer this course at CCM.
- If a 100- or 200-level course is required to fulfill the degree requirements, and was not taken during the student's associate's degree coursework, then the School of Public Affairs and Administration will allow students in the program to satisfy the requirement through a Rutgers online course or the use of exchange registration.
- All students are required to complete their last 30 credits as matriculates of the Rutgers University-Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration. The Rutgers University-Newark residency requirement may be satisfied by taking Rutgers University courses offered by other Rutgers units at the off-campus location. Courses taken as exchange registration do not apply to the residency requirement.

This articulation agreement is intended to serve as a guide for students who want to transfer from County College of Morris to Rutgers University-Newark, School of Public Affairs and Administration. As each student is unique, SPAA will provide students with guidance and information about their individual transfer situation.

## Approval of Agreement

This agreement shall be effective for five years from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2019. To ensure continuity and maintenance of this agreement, it shall be reviewed and updated every five years or as needed when either party makes curricular changes.
